

The Crafter's Workshop Project

Ir-Resistable Turtle Family

Products used:

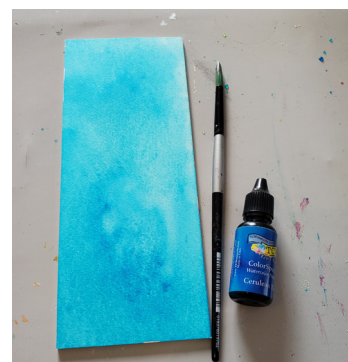
- TCW2319 Slimline Turtle Family stencil
- TCW495s Sea Bubbles stencil
- TCW9052 Super Thick Gloss Medium 2oz.
- TCW9064 Turquoise Stencil Butter 2oz.
- TCW9067 Gamboge Stencil Butter 2oz.
- TCW9025 Plastic Palette knife
- TCW9071 Mixed Media Slimline Boards
- TCW9078 Round Brush #8
- TCW9057 Poolside ColorSparx® Powders



Supplies needed:

- Large pan filled with water to drop stencil in.
- Paper Towels
- Heat Tool
- Spray Bottle with water
- Sponge applicator

Using Cerulean Blue from the Poolside Colorsparx® assortment and a wet watercolor brush, create a watercolor wash on Slimline Mixed Media Board. Dry with heat tool.



Position stencil TCW495s Sea Bubbles on the Slimline Mixed Media Board with bubbles at the edge of the board. Using a palette knife, apply Super Thick Gel thru the stencil to create bubbles. Move the stencil around the edges of the board repeating the application of Super Thick Gel. Carefully dry with a heat tool.



With a wet watercolor brush and additional Cerulean Blue Colorsparx, create another watercolor wash on the slimline board. Notice how the Super Thick Gel resists the Colorsparx. Dry thoroughly.



Next position Turtle Family Stencil over the slimline board. Tape into place with low tack tape. Apply a thin layer of Turquoise Stencil Butter over the stencil. Next, apply streaks of Gamboge Stencil Butter over the Turtles to create highlights. Remove stencil carefully (oooooh, aaaah!) Dry with a heat tool.



To create additional dimension, carefully “bubble” the stencil butter by holding the heat tool close to the surface of the stenciled turtles. Keep the heat tool moving so as not to overheat the board and mediums. Notice how the butter begins to bubble.

The “wetter” the Stencil Butter, the “bigger” the bubbles.

The “drier” the Stencil Butter, the more “delicate” the bubbles.



Experiment with which way you like to #BubbleYourButter!!
