

LESSON PLAN: ZERO DRAWING



MATERIALS

- Tombow MONO Drawing Pencils: 2H, 4B, B, F and H grades
- Tombow MONO Dust Catch Eraser
- Tombow MONO Zero Eraser
- Pencil Sharpener
- 4" x 6" Drawing Paper Panel & Scrap Paper
- Sponge Dauber
- Large Mop Brush
- Tortillion

DIRECTIONS

Use the pattern provided on the following page, or have the students draw their own feather outlines. Have the students use a 2H grade MONO Drawing Pencil to draw the outline of the feather.

1

Have students create a toned graphite surface within the feather by adding a field of graphite on a scrap paper using the 4B grade MONO Drawing Pencil. They can use the MONO Dust Catch Eraser to remove any graphite around the outline.

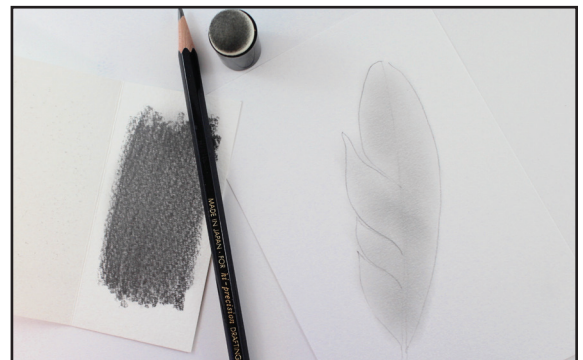
Using the MONO Zero Eraser, have students draw in the parallel barbs. Instead of using their hands to remove the eraser bits, have students use a large, clean mop brush for a smudge-free drawing.

Using the H, F and B grade MONO Drawing Pencils, have students add the darker barb lines, the downy barbs and the dark shaft of the feather. Have students use a tortillion to aid in shading.

Have students add as much detail as they wish to create the drawing. They should go back and forth with the MONO Drawing Pencils and the MONO Zero Eraser to create the shading and highlights on the feather. When finished, have each student sign their masterpiece!



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
